



# Nelson Sports Complex Pool Rules

1. The pool will be closed for public swimming if the air temperature is less than 68 degrees, or at the manager's discretion based on inclement weather, low attendance or unusual circumstances. If the Lightning Prediction System sounds, the pool will close for a minimum of 30 minutes. An all clear signal will sound when it is safe to return to the pool.
2. Admission to the pool shall be refused to all persons having any contagious disease or infectious diseases.
3. A person under the influence of alcohol or exhibiting erratic behavior shall not be permitted in the pool area.
4. Spectators who do not hold a current membership or have not paid the daily fee will not be permitted to enter the pool area.
5. The pool water is not suitable for drinking. Avoid swallowing pool water.
6. Littering is prohibited. In addition, no food, drink or gum is permitted other than in specifically designated and controlled sections of the pool area. Tobacco/marijuana is prohibited. Glass containers are prohibited. Water is acceptable on the pool deck.
7. All persons are encouraged to take a shower before entering the pool area.
8. Personal conduct within the pool facility must be such that the safety of self and others is not jeopardized. No running or rough play, except supervised water sports, is permitted.
9. Only clean footwear, baby strollers or wheelchairs are permitted in the pool area or bathhouse.
10. Spitting, spouting of water, blowing the nose or otherwise introducing contaminants into the pool is not permitted.
11. Glass, soap or other material which might create hazardous conditions or interfere with efficient operation shall not be permitted in the swimming pool or on the pool deck.
12. All apparel worn in the pool must be clean. Bathing suits with liners are recommended. Staff has the right to deny access into the pool if we feel your apparel is not clean or suitable for our public facility.
13. Only Coast Guard approved flotation devices are permitted in the pool. Parents/Guardians must be within an arm's length if a child is wearing a flotation device.
14. No fins, masks or snorkels are permitted in the pool.
15. All children who are not toilet-trained must wear a swim diaper or tightly fitting rubber or plastic pants.
16. Diving in water less than five feet deep is not permitted except when permitted for competitive swimming and training.
17. Caution must be exercised in the use of diving facilities.
18. Lifeguards are responsible for enforcing safety rules and responding to emergencies. Parents or guardians should supervise their children.
19. It is recommended that no one should swim alone.
20. Persons under the age of 10 must be accompanied by a parent, guardian or other responsible person at least 14 years of age.
21. Pool management has the authority to implement and enforce rules that are more stringent or supplement those listed here.
22. All other state and local laws apply.
